# President Lieberman's State of the University Shares Retrospective of Her 12 Year Legacy by Alexandra Clayton

The University of La Verne community came in droves to President Devorah Lieberman's last State of the University address, where she took the university on a celebration journey through the years, highlighting key moments from her tenure as president. She ended the presentation with a final message to everyone. "How can we be distinctive, relevant, and competitive – where everyone says that they belong here?," President Lieberman said, reminding the audience of its unity and purpose. "We are multiple campuses, but one university with one mission and one vision. We are Leos for Life!"

# University of La Verne Names 19th President - Pardis Mahdavi, PhD

Mahdavi brings more than 20 years of scholarship, experience, and leadership in higher education. She most recently served as the provost and executive vice president at the University of Montana, a public flagship research university in Missoula. Mahdavi was selected after an extensive national search by WittKiefer that yielded more than 70 initial candidates. A search advisory committee led by Trustee Valerie Romero narrowed the robust pool of diverse candidates down to four, who met with more than 40 stakeholders in a confidential forum. She said the goal was to bring them all together to put the past into perspective, take a clear look at the future, and determine collectively who would be the best fit for the university.



"When I look at the trajectory of the University of La Verne, how it has adapted to all kinds of learners and how it really embodies the best tradition of access and excellence, and in preparing learners to really uphold democracy and engage in social transformation in the way that we would want a 21st century higher education institution to do, I am honored to join the community and excited about the work and collaborations ahead to serve our students," Mahdavi said.

# Generous Gift to Summer Reach Program, Serves 49 Local Students



The College of Business received a \$50,000 gift in the summer of 2022 from Morton Fleischer to support the University of La Verne's REACH/Fleischer residential summer Program (formerly the REACH program). The REACH/Fleischer program is now in its seventeenth year. The objective of this program is to put college within the reach of any student no matter how unattainable a goal may seem REACH provides participants with a taste of various aspects of college life to create and sustain their motivation to aim for college after graduating from high school.

# 2023 REACH/Fleischer Scholars Program

This year (2023), REACH welcomed 55 high school juniors (35 female and 21 male) to attend the summer program that started on June 4 and ended on June 23, 2023. The three weeks program by delving into the business world and learning about management and organization, marketing, economics, accounting, finance, creating a business website, success skills, entrepreneurship, teamwork, and environmental sustainability.



REACH participants were also exposed to college admissions and financial aid as well as team-building, critical thinking, environmental/water education, and leadership. In addition, members of the University of La Verne Enactus "enactus.org" team served as counselors/mentors to the students.

# **ULV Student Businesses Raise Over \$21,000 for Charity**



During the fall semester, students in the Integrated Business Program (IBP) at the University of La Verne raised over \$21,000 for local charities while also learning valuable business skills.

On December 15, the students celebrated their accomplishments and presented their donations to the charities. The businesses included Bee

Fresh, Cover, Sip 'N Save, Powder Buddy, VerneX, ClearTech, and Priceless Packs. All six teams sold out of their products, a first for the program since it began in 2011.

The winning team, ClearTech, had a net profit of \$5,931.70 which donated to the Hearing Loss Association of America – Los Angeles chapter, the nation's largest organization for people with hearing loss.



# MEMORIAM DR. CAROL SAWYER

From University of La Verne's former President, Devorah Lieberman's, "Message from the President"

I am saddened to share that our dear Professor Emerita Carol Sawyer passed away on March 11.

Dr. Sawyer was the Director of the Master of Science in Leadership and Management (MSLM) program in the College of Business and Public Management helping, mentoring, and serving students in person and online. She tirelessly worked to triple the enrollment of the MSLM program and to expand its offerings to 9 Southern California locations until her retirement in 2016.

She was an outstanding teacher who was beloved by students and colleagues. In recognition of her teaching excellence, she received the University's Excellence in Teaching Award in 2012 and a Distinguished Professor award from the Governing Board of the University's Alumni Association in 2007.

Before joining La Verne in 1994, she worked at numerous government, business, and non-profit organizations including the South Coast AQMD and the Department of Education in Washington, DC. She was an international traveler visiting 27 countries and was active in professional associations and received the Outstanding Service Award from the International Organizational Behavior Teaching Society for Management Educators in 2008.

As the Director of the MSLM Program, she initiated many innovative activities including a visiting author series that brought some of the most distinguished American leadership and management scholars to campus. Some remarkable guests included James MacGregor Burns, Warren Bennis, Joseph Rost, Jay Conger, Margaret Wheatley, Terry Deal, and Daniel Pink.
